

2021-2022 Spartanburg Community College Early College Application Notes

As you complete your 2021-2022 Spartanburg Community College Early College application, please note the following statements. **KEEP PAGES 1 and 2 FOR YOUR RECORDS!**

- 1. Use only a black or blue pen instead of a pencil or a pen of a different color.
- 2. A social security number is required to process your application.
- 3. SCC provides reasonable accommodations to qualified individuals who have, have a history of, or are regarded as having a disability. Qualified students who are seeking accommodations are required to self-identify with the office of Student Disability Services (SDS) and provide documentation of their disability. Individualized EducationPlans (IEPs) and 504 plans do not automatically transition to the college setting and further documentation of disability may be required before registration with SDS can be completed. Additionally, documentation provided, including IEPs and 504 plans, will be reviewed to determine which accommodations are appropriate for college/post-secondary courses and programs. Certain accommodations, such as extended time for assignments and retake of quizzes, tests, and exams are not provided for college courses. Accommodations in the college/post-secondary setting are reviewed and approved individually for each student and each class for which the student is registered. This process is applicable for all courses offered by SCC including those offered on the College campus or courses offered at the high school or career/technology center.
- 4. Spartanburg Community College maintains accurate and confidential student records and recognizes the right of students to gain access to their academic records in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974 (Buckley Amendment) and College policy. Amendments to FERPA under section 507 of the U. S. Patriot Act of 2001 also apply to the release of student records. The purpose of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, known as FERPA or the "Buckley Amendment", applies to all educational institutions and educational agencies that receive funds under any program administered by the U. S. Secretary of Education. The purpose of the Act is two-fold: (1) to assure students attending an



institution of postsecondary education access to their education records; and (2) to protect such individuals' rights to privacy by limiting the transferability of their records without their consent. In accordance with FERPA, the College is restricted as to the release of certain educational records information without the written consent of the student. The College can release "directory information" which includes name, program of study, full or part-time status, degrees and awards, and dates of attendance without the student's written permission. Students must notify the Registrar in writing that he or she does not want any or all of the information designated as directory information disclosed. Students must develop accountability for their enrollment and performance in college courses as well as advocacy and communication skills to be able to discuss academic questions and concerns on their own with their college instructors. Parents should not attempt to contact their student's college instructors regarding student grades and academic progress. This policy is applicable for all courses offered by SCC regardless of class location.
